

SUBJECT: Discussion on the Feasibility of Stop Signs on East Avenue

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

Staff has been contacted regarding the feasibility of placing stop signs on East Avenue. Staff has received complaints from residents along East Avenue that there is a speeding problem, this problem occurs through all hours of the day and night.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact to the City is minimal dependent on the number of stop signs recommended.

RECOMMENDATION:

Traffic Committee to determine a possible solution to the speeding problem along East Avenue by looking at the feasibility of placing stop signs in the area.

SUBJECT: Discussion on the Feasibility of Speed Bumps or Rumble Strips along Wallis Ave

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

Staff has been contacted by numerous citizens regarding speeding problems on Wallis Avenue between Grove Avenue and Steele Avenue. Staff is suggesting numerous options including but not limited to:

1. Speed Bumps
2. Rumble Strips
3. Stop Signs
4. Radar Speed Limit Sign

These options would be in addition to extra patrol by officers and using speed radar in the area.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact to the City will roughly be under \$1,000 if speed bumps, rumble strips or stop signs are selected. The cost for a radar speed limit sign is approximately \$5,000.

RECOMMENDATION:

Traffic Committee to determine a possible solution to the speeding problem along Wallis Avenue.
